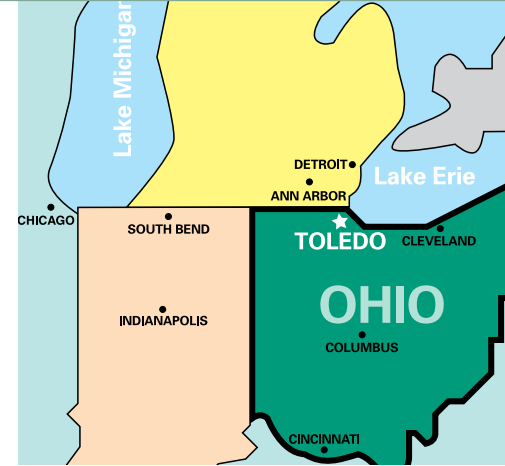

At The Toledo Hospital Family Medicine Residency, our clerkships give you solid practical experiences that will carry you through your medical training. Our program exposes you to the skills necessary for you to become a family physician, while allowing you the flexibility to investigate certain areas in which you are most interested. Many of your experiences will be based at The Toledo Hospital (TTH) and Toledo Children's Hospital (TCH). TTH is a 774-bed facility and is the largest acute care facility in the region. TCH is a 151-bed facility and is the region's only accredited children's hospital. Together, TTH and TCH serve 27 counties in northwest Ohio and southeast Michigan. They are two of 10 hospitals within ProMedica Health System, which is ranked by Verispas as the No. 1 most integrated health system in the nation.

Clerkships

Our comprehensive program offers clerkships for third- and fourth-year medical students and a special summer program for first-year students.

Third- and fourth-year clerkships offer a wide array of clinical opportunities, hands-on experience and flexibility in your learning experience.



You will have the opportunity enhance your ambulatory, clinical, and procedural skills in an educationally-focused outpatient and inpatient setting. Evaluation and assistance in the overall management of patient care will be stressed under the direct supervision of a family medicine preceptor.

The summer program is available for students from schools accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education and American Osteopathic Association. In addition to developing your history and physical examination skills, you will have the opportunity to be involved in day-to-day patient care and a variety of clinical procedures. The deadline to



apply for the summer clerkship is May 1.

Clerkships are traditionally one month in duration; however, two-week clerkships may be available for special circumstances. A stipend, complimentary lodging and meals may be available.
